SOURCES OF INFORMATION

Whatever you are carving seek as much information and inspiration as possible. Some sources are:

- 1. There are numerous specialist books on carving ideas, many with step-by-step guides. Books on animals, birds, fish, etc. are also useful if that is what you wish to carve.
- 2. Physical objects are a good starting point. Charity shops, local fairs, etc. are a good source and often very cheap. However, you must remember these objects are interpretations themselves therefore it is still worth looking at the real thing and consulting books.
- 3. Take plenty of photographs from all angles if you are planning to carve an existing object or even a person. If you are planning to carve animals make sure you photograph all views including the back-end; there are very few images of the back-ends of animals on the Internet!
- 4. Magazines like the <u>Woodcarving</u> or <u>Chip Chats</u> (from America) magazines contain a wealth of information on carving topics, step-by-step guides and including advertisements for tools, wood, etc.
- 5. The Internet is a valuable research tool for images of whatever you want to carve.
- 6. Your local library is a good source of ideas.
- 7. Sometimes the shape and characteristics of a piece of wood may inspire the carving.
- 8. Fellow carvers will provide ideas, guidance, etc.
